In this series, participants will discover the merciful way that God seeks us out when we have sinned and calls us back to himself. They will examine the sacrament from the perspective of both the priest and the penitent, and they will explore the scriptural foundation of the sacrament. This study will help them recognize the beauty of the Rite of Penance and the transformative power of the grace God offers us in this sacrament.

A DRE tells the story of how Forgiven was used to bring her parish families back to Confession and the Mass.

Stacey Pinder, DRE of Christ the King parish in Milwaukie, Oregon, recounts the incredible story of how *Signs of Grace* and *Forgiven* were used to engage the kids and adults of her parish and lead them back to God's mercy in the Sacrament of Confession and return to Mass.

Stacey Pinder, **DRE of Christ the King**, on the impact of *Signs of Grace* and *Forgiven*

After ten years in religious education, Stacey Pinder decided "it was time to shake things up."

Of the twenty-five families that Pinder worked with at Christ the King, only three regularly attended Sunday Mass. She wondered, for many of them, if First Communion was more a rite of passage with dress-up clothes and a party than the sacrament of receiving Jesus—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

Pinder decided to shift from classroom instruction to a family catechesis model using *Signs of Grace* for kids and *Forgiven* for parents.

Then, something happened.

"It felt very different from the first lesson," Pinder said after her first session using the new model.

There was a difference, to be sure, in the children, but a powerful transformation began in the lives of their parents once they started using Forgiven.

From what parents shared with her, she realized that some of them had been "carrying very heavy burdens."

One couple called to say that they had scheduled a time for them both to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation after a long absence. Another couple arranged to have their marriage blessed. Three couples enrolled in RCIA to complete their sacraments. One parent, after she had been to Reconciliation, told Pinder: "I've never felt so free."

"All of my families," Pinder said, "started going to Mass."

FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR DR. BEN AKERS



November is the month dedicated to the holy souls in Purgatory. We call them "holy" because they will attain the vision of God when their time of purgation is complete. The root of the word "Purgatory" — which means "to purify or make clean" — discloses the purpose of Purgatory: to cleanse us from our attachment to worldly things. Purgatory, according to the glossary in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, is a "state of final purification after death and before entrance into heaven." It explains the temporary and intermediate states that souls endure who did not die in mortal sin but are not yet "perfect as [their] heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48).

In both the Old and New Testaments, we find evidence that our prayers impact the souls in Purgatory. The Old Testament, in particular, provides us with a great example in the Jewish general Judas Maccabeus, who prays for some deceased soldiers to make "atonement for the dead, that they might be delivered from their sin" (2 Mc 12:45). Thus, we find an example that indicates that our prayers help to purify the souls in Purgatory. As Catholics, we are given the great ability and responsibility to intercede for our brothers and sisters in this intermediate state. Our prayers help to expedite their time in Purgatory so they can see God's face more quickly. Within the Catholic Church, there is a tradition that holds that Jesus appeared to St.

Eternal Father, I offer thee the Most Precious Blood of thy Divine Son, Jesus, in union with the Masses said throughout the world today, for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory, for sinners everywhere, for sinners in the universal Church, those in my own home and within my family.

Amen.


