Produced entirely by volunteers, this film is a powerful way to introduce the upcoming solemnity to your parishioners and inform them of the Real Presence of Jesus through a creative retelling of the events surrounding this Eucharistic miracle.



Sacred Art Series

It can be easy to forget that beauty plays a significant role in the life of the Church. Yet this is one of the transcendentals that points us directly to our Creator. The Church and her many beauties reflect that. Over the years, Catholics have created thousands of works of art that direct those who look upon them to God himself. They act as a reminder that man was made by and for God, and, as Pope St. John Paul II says in his *Letter to Artists*, "God therefore called man into existence, committing to him the craftsman's task. Through his 'artistic creativity' man appears more than ever 'in the image of God'. . . . With loving regard, the divine Artist passes on to the human artist a spark of his own surpassing wisdom, calling him to share in his creative power."

When we look at works of art, we can often get lost in their complexities. Things that may appear simple can also reveal a deeper meaning when seen through a theological, historical, cultural, or scriptural lens—and most of us are not experts in dissecting these works of beauty.

To help us understand the meaning behind sacred art, Taylor Kemp and Dr. Ben Akers work together to discuss what stories different pieces of art are really telling. In *Sacred Art*, viewers can gain a greater appreciation of the beauty of art by uncovering its many layers.

Each episode focuses on a unique and beautiful work of sacred art. These commentaries not only showcase the work of art but

also incorporate a narrative of the saint or story in the Bible. Your parishioners can learn more about Pentecost, the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist, Corpus Christi, Saints Peter and Paul, and so much more.
