LOVING AND SERVING THE POOR

How do we love, serve, and help those who are less fortunate than us? This question is one that Christ challenges us to make through his teachings. He asks us to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty, shelter the homeless, and give alms to the poor. While we can act generously in many ways, it is also possible to neglect some of these commands in favor of convenience.

What, then, can be done to encourage a serving heart in your parish? One possible answer is found in Revive Parishes' *Loving and Serving the Poor* offered on FORMED. Taught by Franciscan friar Fr. Mark Mary Ames, C.F.R., this course can be your guide to understanding and living a life dedicated to the service of others.



Each episode lasts only a few minutes long and covers the many aspects of living a life of authentic charity. Using Scripture and personal experiences as a model, Fr. Mark Mary clearly demonstrates the great need for service within our parishes and communities. He addresses specific challenges—including time, indifference, and judgment—as well as some of the beautiful outcomes of service. One of the episodes, "The Three Tiers," focuses on the structural, material, and relational wounds, and how the Church addresses and demonstrates her role to play in the world. At each level, the Body of Christ is called to act and meet the needs of the people. Through Fr. Mark Mary's teachings, viewers can realize the personal invitation from Christ to act while also feeling equipped to understand the responsibility and how to approach service.


This September, teach your parishioners more about some of the Church's great saints with the following resources on FORMED:



September 5: St. Teresa of Calcutta

Mother Teresa: No Greater Love

Years after her death, Mother Teresa remains a model of the faith and living out the corporal works of mercy. 
Mysteries of the Rosary | Paradisus Dei: The Sorrowful Mysteries
